Derived from the French term "belle vue," beautiful view, Bellevue lives up to its name, with scenic vistas of both Lake Washington and the Olympic and Cascade Mountains. Between Bellevue and nearby Seattle, there is lots to see. So, we have included some tours in the Convention schedule for your enjoyment.

Our hotel, the Hyatt Regency Bellevue on Seattle's Eastside, is just 20 minutes from Seattle-Tacoma International Airport and nine miles east of Seattle. It is ideally situated, linked via connecting sky bridges with more than 250 shops, 45 restaurants and various entertainment options. As you will see from the map at the end of this booklet, all UFDC events will take place on three floors with elevators and escalators between them. The hotel staff are very excited about our Convention and are looking forward to taking care of us.

Your UFDC Convention team has worked hard to prepare a fun week packed with a diverse array of wonderful events. You may find it difficult to choose!

Our Annual Business Meeting is the primary reason for Convention. At this year's meeting, club delegates will vote on matters pertaining to the functioning of UFDC. Club Presidents will receive all the relevant information beforehand to share with their members and their delegate(s). Attendees will also be able to attend Regional Gatherings and the Open Forum.

In keeping with UFDC's mission, there is a fantastic array of learning events - Workshops, Seminars, the Competitive Exhibit (including Highlight Tours), Special Exhibits, Programs, Gatherings, and some special treats for our Junior Collectors.

If this is your first Convention or you have not been to one in a while, make sure to attend the Convention Orientation program on Monday afternoon. Make a note of all your questions and bring them along!

There will be LOTS of shopping opportunities in the world class UFDC Sales Room and the UFDC Boutique. And on Public Day, be sure to check out the books on the Publisher's Preview tables.

The Convention is also a big fundraiser for UFDC and there will be a number of occasions when attendees will be able to show their appreciation by making a financial contribution. Along with the Ice Cream Social Welcome Gathering, the Helpers, and the Silent Auctions, there will be a Movie Premiere Karaoke Party and a Movie Matinee - GREAT fun!

We are also offering a number of special ticketed events, including lunches, afternoon teas, and dinners, where you will be able to enjoy delicious food, great programs, and receive a variety of wonderful souvenirs as mementos. New for this year is a special, club hosted, desserts event, with no souvenir. Having had a "sneak peek" at the plans for these events, there will no doubt be one or two surprises as well!

You are guaranteed to take away many happy memories from Bellevue as well as a number of mementos, including the Convention Souvenir Journal. Just make sure you send your event request form in by the deadline – you don't want to miss out on the fun!

HOTEL PARKING

Self-parking is \$20 per day/part day from 8:00 AM Monday to 8:00 PM Friday. Self-parking is free from 8:00 PM Friday to 8:00 AM Monday.

ACCESSIBILITY

SPECIAL DIETARY NEEDS

For attendees who indicated special dietary needs on their Convention registration, alternate menu choices will be provided at all meal events including our banquet. Your Convention packet will include special colored meal tickets indicating your needs. ONLY those who indicated special needs meals will be able to receive substitutions at meal events. Please note that substitutions are made at the discretion of the hotel, UFDC does not control that.

PET POLICY

The Hyatt Regency Bellevue is pet friendly. Upon request, your dog will receive a welcome letter, a dog bed, bowls for food and water, and a welcome biscuit. Fees are: 1-6 nights \$100 per stay, 7-30 nights \$200 per stay. A \$75 additional fee will occur for reservations that fail to provide advance notice of pets in guest rooms. Weight Limits are one dog: up to 50 pounds, two dogs: up to 75 pounds, combined.

REGISTRATION AND TICKET INFORMATION

Attendees should report to the UFDC Registration desk located on Level 1 after checking in to the hotel. See booklet for registration times on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. Attendees will receive a registration packet with their name badge, ribbons, final schedule booklet, event tickets and a tote bag and Souvenir Journal. A photo ID is required for Convention check in, but you only need your UFDC membership card for entrance to the Annual Business Meeting. You may not give or sell your event or banquet tickets to another person. Event tickets are not transferable. These tickets are marked with your name which enables UFDC to trace and protect your event favors and/or souvenir doll. Please do not post event tickets for sale or trade anywhere at the Convention.

SHIPPING

Our hotel does not have an onsite business center. We are working with them to secure packing and shipping services to be set up at the hotel. In the meantime, if you need to send anything to the hotel in advance of Convention, packages will be accepted for registered guests up to 5 days prior to their arrival. The hotel will not accept or hold packages for recipients without a reservation. Packages should be addressed to: Hyatt Regency Bellevue, Guest Name, 900 Bellevue Way NE, Bellevue, WA 98004. Charges are \$7 per package or box less than 25 lbs, \$10 per box weighing 25-100 lbs, \$25 per box over 100 lbs, with letters and FedEx or UPS Envelopes being complimentary. There is a storage fee of \$5 per day per package if not claimed within 5 days after departure.

EMPLOYMENT BOOTH & CONVENTION CHARMS

CONVENTION ACTIVITIES

UFDC

ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING

The Annual Business Meeting will be held on Friday morning and is the primary reason for Convention. Annual reports will be presented by the Officers of the corporation and club delegates will vote on matters pertaining to the functioning of UFDC. All UFDC members are encouraged to attend. No other activities are scheduled to conflict. You MUST bring your UFDC membership card to attend the meeting. Voting delegates must be checked in no later than 8:30 AM to have voting privileges. If you forget your card, replacements will be available in the UFDC Mini Office.

REGIONAL GATHERINGS

Regional Gatherings are on Thursday afternoon. Not only do they provide attendees the opportunity to discuss what's going on in their region, but it is a great way to meet people, make new friends and get to see and hear from your Regional Director up close and personal!

OPEN FORUM

The Open Forum is scheduled just after the Regional Meetings on Thursday afternoon. It is your opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback and comments to the UFDC leadership.

LEARNING EVENTS

CONVENTION ORIENTATION

If this is your first UFDC Convention or if you haven't been in a while, we recommend you attend the Convention Orientation session on Monday afternoon. The session will provide you with some hints and tips about how to get the most out of Convention and also get your questions answered, so come along!

WORKSHOPS (see pages 28-31 for details)

Chair Nancy Percival has once again gathered a talented array of Workshop presenters! With sixteen Workshops offered in 3-hour time blocks, each class has been selected to challenge the student to learn new skills or to entertain them by creating something special. If you sew for your doll, you'll be delighted at the list of offerings. If you like to craft items to go with your dolls, then you'll be excited to see there are Workshops for your taste as well. The complexity of each Workshop is noted in the detailed descriptions. To help you decide which ones to request, finished Workshop project photos are available for viewing on the UFDC website under the Convention tab. Workshops are ticketed events at an additional cost beyond Convention registration.

SEMINARS (see pages 31-34 for details)

ReAL Services offers attendees the opportunity to attend educational seminars. Organized by Chair Cathy Noone, the sixteen Seminars are ticketed events for small classes of in-depth study. Space is limited and there is a small fee. Seats not occupied ten minutes after the published start time will be forfeited and sold to attendees waiting in line outside the Seminar rooms. No refunds are given to attendees who do not check in on time. Use the request form included in your Convention packet to sign up. Seminars typically last about 3 hours.

COMPETITIVE EXHIBIT

One of the most rewarding and educational experiences of Convention is participating in the Competitive Exhibit. Chair Linda Edward has assembled 120 diverse categories which are listed in the enclosed Competitive Exhibit Booklet along with entry forms. Having attendees share their dolls, UFDC members provide one another with the greatest opportunity for doll study in the world! Please note that the deadline for entries is July 2, 2023.

COMPETITIVE EXHIBIT HIGHLIGHT TOURS

Organized by Chair Stephanie Moore, this is your opportunity to hear the judges explain the judging process. The tours are free, but the number of spaces are limited so you need to sign up for tickets in advance. Sign up is on Wednesday morning and the tours take place on Thursday morning.

SPECIAL EXHIBITS (see page 35 for details)

Each year, Convention attendees look forward to enjoying a variety of Special Exhibits presented by our members and clubs. Exhibits are open to all attendees at no additional fee. Special Exhibits Chair Kathleen Allen looks forward to welcoming you to the four displays in Bellevue.

PROGRAMS (see pages 36-38 for details)

Connie Reynolds, Director of ReAL Services, has arranged 12 Programs, led by subject matter experts, on various doll topics. There is no additional fee for Programs and seating is available on a first come basis. Programs typically last about an hour.

GATHERINGS (see page 38 for details)

Want to meet other collectors that share your interests in a specific type of doll? Chair Connie Reynolds has organized eight Gatherings on Thursday and Friday evenings. UFDC provides space for these special interest and collector groups to gather. Everyone is welcome and no fee is charged. Available on a first come basis as space allows.

JUNIOR COLLECTORS (see pages 39-40 for details)

Junior Collectors will enjoy a great week courtesy of Junior Co-Coordinators Erica Cruz and Kim McIntyre-Bott. Juniors will also be very welcome at the vast majority of the other events during the week. A fun time is guaranteed!

UFDC SALES ROOM

Each year, dealers from near and far travel to the UFDC Convention to display their vast array of wonderful dolls and accessories in our world class Sales Room. This year, Chair Gail Lemmon has an exceptional line-up of dealers to delight attendees all week long. Whether your passion is for antique, vintage, or modern, there's sure to be something for everyone in the UFDC Sales Room located in the gorgeous 1st Floor Evergreen Ballroom.

UFDC BOUTIQUE

We will once again be locating the UFDC Boutique in a separate room. So come along to the Grand A Ballroom on the 2nd floor, where you will find great merchandise - dolls and accessories, convention souvenirs and amazing "Tender Loving Care" type bargains. Everything you buy from the UFDC Boutique supports our organization.

PUBLIC DAY/PUBLISHER'S PREVIEW

Public Day will be held following the Annual Business Meeting on Friday. This will enable members of the public, plus UFDC members who did not register for Convention, to access the Sales Room. To add to the enjoyment, Publisher's Preview tables will be found just outside the Sales Room.

FUNDRAISING

ICE CREAM SOCIAL WELCOME GATHERING

New this year is a trivia component. Anyone donating \$50 or more will be eligible to participate by correctly answering a doll or UFDC-related trivia question. Prizes will include dolls donated to the museum for fundraising purposes.

MOVIE PREMIERE KARAOKE PARTY

Put on your blue suede shoes and come get all shook up with UFDC's Fundraising Committee! In anticipation of Saturday's movie matinee, "It Happened at the World's Fair," starring Elvis Presley, the Committee will host their legendary annual fundraising event. SPECIAL EVENTS

TICKETED MEAL EVENTS (see pages 24-27 for details)

The meal events feature a wonderful program, a delicious luncheon, afternoon tea, or dinner, and attendees receive either an exclusive limited edition doll created by one of UFDC's many talented artists or another limited edition souvenir. Companion items are often available at an additional cost. In addition,

new for this year, is a special, club hosted, desserts event, with no souvenir. Space at these events is limited and only ticket holders will be admitted. See full descriptions in this booklet. The ticket price for these events is based on the combined cost of the event souvenir and the meal, and other costs such as the AV. Meal events are a key part of UFDC being able to meet our contractual food and beverage commitment to the hotel. A BIG thanks to the various clubs and groups who are hosting these events and to Donelle Denery, the Meal Event Coordinator, who has worked with them to create what will no doubt be lots of memorable moments.

TOURS (see page 40 for details)

Details of the tours, including prices, are on a separate sheet in your packet. And look in your tote bag for information on other places to go/things to do - we want you to make the most of your time here!

GALA BANQUET

Saturday's banquet is a great way to wrap up the Convention. A delicious meal with doll friends, entertainment, and a fun video created by Kathy Monier, capturing the highlights from our week at convention. The grand finale will be the unveiling of this year's fantastic souvenir doll by Alicia and Charles Carver - what a great way to end the week.

CONVENTION RULES

You may not lend your convention badge or ribbons to any other person for any reason. Allowing another person to use your badge or ribbons will result in the loss of your Convention privileges for the remainder of Convention. If you lose your badge, ticket, or ribbon go to the UFDC Office for replacement.

You may not give or sell your tickets to another person. This is to protect your souvenirs. At the Gala Banquet, each table host will have a list of those assigned to their table. No others will be seated and tickets with written alterations will not be honored.

Children under 8 years of age are not permitted in any area of the Convention. Some restrictions apply to attendees under age 18. No infants or strollers are allowed in the Sales Room at any time. Registered children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

You may not sell from your room during Convention. Sales, by authorized dealers, are permitted only in the Sales Room, at the Publisher's Preview and in locations staffed by UFDC officials.

Photography is allowed in the Competitive and Special Exhibits areas at all times EXCEPT DURING GRAND OPENINGS OF THESE EXHIBITS. Pictures may be used for commercial purposes only if they meet the stipulations of the "Exhibitor and Photographer Agreement." There is no photography allowed during programs including those given at meal events.

Images of people or items exhibited at any UFDC function, if used commercially, must include the following caption: "Photographed at the United Federation of Doll Clubs Inc. Annual Convention." All use of images must be in compliance with the "Exhibitor and Photographer Agreement."

By registering for the Annual Convention, attendees agree that their image or images of items they exhibit at the convention, maybe used by UFDC without any additional recognition, fees, or compensation.

Cell Phones - please silence your phones during presentations or when visiting exhibits. If you must make or take a call, please leave the room.

Many thanks for abiding by these rules - they are there to keep everyone safe and secure.

Cancellation policy - Registrations are not transferable.

If you are unable to attend the Convention you may:

- **A.** Cancel before May 15 and receive a refund of your fees minus the cancellation fee of \$50. Your Convention souvenir doll will be shipped to you if you have purchased one.
- **B.** Return your registration receipt to the UFDC Central Office, along with instructions to release your souvenirs and event favors to a specified person. This person must fill out a form at the UFDC Office in order for your items to be ready for pickup following the Saturday night banquet.
- **C.** Return your registration receipt to the UFDC Central Office with instructions to ship your souvenirs and event favors to you. They will be shipped by the end of September. Shipping charges will apply.

After May 15, all registrations, including ticketed events are confirmed. No cancellations or refunds will be issued after this date. You will receive all souvenirs and event favors from ticketed events and workshops. Seminar tickets are non-refundable.

Elizabeth has been collecting Hina dolls since 1980 when her daughter was born on March 3rd, Hinamatsuri. They have celebrated every year since. They study the holiday and share their knowledge about it whenever they can.

Indigenous Dolls of Region 1 By Region 1

Pictures depict the difficult travels for pioneers on the Oregon Trail. Discover stories of the Indians and the pioneers that traveled hard and long distances to come west. The display includes an authentic Oregon trail antique doll, her trunk, and wardrobe; beautiful Indian Dolls, including Chief Seattle and his daughter Sacajawea, in their wonderful garments; Indian dolls made by Mary Frances Woods in a variety of materials including wood, cloth, and papier mache; two beautiful large Indian busts; antique Indian baskets and blankets; a collection of Alaskan artifacts from the early 1900s, including Inuit Dolls.

Little Red Riding Hood In memory of Elaine Pardee By Region 2N

Little Red Riding Hood (LRRH) is a classic folk tale, famously included in Charles Perrault's 1697 collection of fairy tales. It has inspired dolls, books, and playthings for many generations. 
